- ExpressVote Machines use touch-screen technology that produces a paper record for tabulation.
- As a marker, the ExpressVote handles the entire marking process, eliminating unclear marks and the need for interpretation of the voter's mark.
- Federal law requires that every polling location have an ExpressVote Machine as an accommodation for voters with disabilities.

The ExpressVote Machine offers Accessible, Independent, and Universal Voting

First Come, First Serve:

- 1) Any eligible voter can use the ExpressVote Machine
- 2) Local election officials will ask if you want to use the ExpressVote Machine or a paper ballot
- 3) You can request to use the ExpressVote Machine

How does the ExpressVote Machine work?



- You (the eligible voter) insert the ballot card into the ExpressVote Machine with the cut corner of the ballot card on the top right side.
- Audio options and adaptations are available on the ExpressVote Machine.
- You will mark your votes by touching the selection of your choice.
 - You can go back and forward if you wish to make changes on your ballot.
- After you have marked each choice, you may want to review how you voted.
 If you want to make a change to one of your votes, simply click on the new choice twice.
- Once you have reviewed and verified your choices, touch Print Ballot.
- After your card has printed, you will insert your ballot card into the bin. Your choices from the printed ballot card are scanned, recorded, and the printed ballot card is deposited into the secure bin.

The ExpressVote Machine is ADA-Friendly, Avoids Overvoting, offers Simple Activation, and Easier-to-Read Ballots.
